



THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWER

One of the things at Christmas that never ceases to amaze me is the number of prophecies of Jesus' first coming that were completely fulfilled as predicted by many different prophets.

I would like to share some of these with you now and maybe we all can appreciate even more the accuracy of the Scriptures.

There are over 4000 religions in the world today and Christianity is the only one that has a Bible that is all truth and never changes.

A Messianic Prophecy is a prediction of the future made under divine inspiration or a revelation of God concerning the Anointed One (Messiah)

A total of 18 prophecies were fulfilled at the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem in Judea. There are two Bethlehems in Israel. The one is in Galilee (near Nazareth) and is only mentioned once in Scripture (Joshua 19:10,15). The Bethlehem that is near Jerusalem in Judah is the one best known in Scripture. Not only is it the place of Jesus' birth (Micah 5:2), but is where Jacob's wife Rachel is buried (Genesis 35:19-20). It is where the story of Ruth took place. King David was born there (I Samuel 17:15), David was also anointed by the prophet Samuel (I Samuel 16:4-13). Joseph and Mary were from Bethlehem (Luke 2:1-7).

Here are some Old Testament prophecies pointing to Christ: (1) He would be a descendant of Noah's son, Shem Gen. 9:26, (2) A descendent of Abraham Gen. 12:3, (3) Through Abraham's son Isaac – Gen. 17:21, (4) Through Isaac's son, Jacob – Gen. 28:14), (5) Through the tribe of Judah – Gen. 49:8), (6) Through the family of Jesse – Isaiah 11:1, (7) Through the house of David – Jeremiah 23:5, (8) Place of His birth – Micah 5:2), (9) Born of a virgin – Isaiah 7:14, (10) Given a divine name – Isaiah 7:14, (11) Gifts presented to Him – Psalm 72:10-11, (12) Massacre of children after His birth-Jeremiah 31:15, (13) His escape into Egypt – Hosea 11:1, (14) His childhood poverty – Isaiah 53:2, (15) His spirit filled nature from birth – Isaiah 1:1-2.

Probably one of the most famous prophecies comes from the book of Daniel 9:24-27 which is called the 70 weeks of years. This prophecy clearly states that the Messiah will appear and will be killed before the Temple is destroyed (this happened in 70 A.D.).

Why is this significant? Because when the Romans destroyed the Temple all the Jewish records of genealogy were burned up. Thus if someone claiming to be the Messiah had to be born before 70 A.D. so His genealogy could be verified. Jesus met all the prophecies plus His genealogy could be checked out.

Here are some probabilities of prophecies being fulfilled exactly as predicted. The odds of someone being born in Bethlehem in Judea at that time was 1 in 300,000. The odds of eight prophecies of the Messiah being fulfilled is 1 in 10 to the 17th power. That is like covering the state of Texas with silver dollars two feet deep and having a man blindfolded pick out a marked silver dollar on the first try.

Alfred Edersheim, a biblical scholar found 456 prophecies on Jesus birth, death, resurrection and His second coming. The odds of one person fulfilling only 48 of these is 1 to 10 to the 157 power. That is roughly 10.5%.

None of these prophecies would be possible unless God was in it.

Think about this. Abraham's wife, Sarah was well beyond her child bearing years when God told her she would have a son to Abraham who was 10 years older than she. He was 100 years old and she was 90 when she had Isaac. God had told them to give him that name. Abraham and Sarah waited 25 years for that promise to come true. By waiting this long it proved to the world that it could only be God's doing because logically neither Sarah or Abraham were of an age to have children.. Isaiah first prophesied of Jesus birth 700 years before it came to be.

The only other couples with a miraculous birth were Zacharias and Elizabeth and Joseph and Mary. They too were given the names for their children.

As we read through the Old Testament and the Christmas story in the Gospels, we see God has a plan for mankind and Jesus is the person who will redeem us and atone for our sins.

The Gospels of Matthew and Luke give the genealogy of Jesus to prove He was qualified to be the Messiah and to sit and reign on David's throne. Matthew presents Joseph's side through Solomon and Luke gives Mary's side through Nathan, another son of David.

Why is this important? A descendent of Solomon named Jeconiah was such a terrible person that God put a curse on his line and said that no other descendent could reign on his throne.

What was unique about Matthew's genealogy is that he lists four women in the Jesus line. This was unheard of in that day as only men's names were used to give the genealogy of a family.

The four women were Tamar, Rahab, Ruth and Bathsheba. Three of these women either practiced prostitution or committed adultery, while Ruth who was an upright and moral person was a Moabitess. Her people hated Israel, yet God used these women to fulfill His purposes. The listing of these women shows God's forgiveness and grace to all people.

In looking at the part of the wise men coming to Jesus, Arnold Fruchtenbaum shares some interesting points. (1) The story of the shepherds and the Wise Men was separated by about 2 years.. (2) When the Wise Men did find Jesus He was in a home, not a stable. (3) We do not know how many Wise Men came. The Christmas song "We Three Kings" assumes it was three people because Scripture says they brought gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. But maybe 10 people brought gold, 20 frankincense and 30 myrrh. There is no way of knowing. What we do know is that Mary and Joseph used those gifts to live in Egypt for a while since King Herod was slaughtering children 2 and under. (4) Matthew in writing about these Wise Men never says they were kings, because the Greek word for Wise Men is" magi "or astrologers.

Fruchtenbaum says there are 5 reasons the star they followed was not physical. They are (1) It is the personal star of the King of the Jews. (2) It appears and disappears. (3) It moves from east to west. (4) It moves from north to south. (5) It literally hovers over one single house in Bethlehem.

He claims the Greek word for star simply means radiance or brilliance. With this star coming in the form of a light, he feels what we have is the appearance of the "Shechinah Glory", rather than an astrologer's star. The Shechinah Glory is the visible manifestation of God's presence as in the cloud by day and the fire by night when the Israelites were traveling through the desert to the promised land.


These men traveled from Babylon where hundreds of years before King Nebuchadnezzar had made Daniel head of the Babylonian school of astrology. Since Daniel had saved their lives by interpreting the king's dream, Fruchtenbaum feels that some of them turned to worshipping the true God.

He says gold is the symbol of royalty or kingship, frankincense is the symbol of deity, because it was part of the special scent burned on the Altar of Incense and myrrh was associated in the Old Testament with death and embalming.

Hope this fresh look at some Messianic prophecies is a blessing to you. Have a blessed Christmas and New Year!!!



The way we usually remember the 12 days of Christmas in our society is by a simple nonsense song for the holidays in which someone bestows lavish gifts to a person they love. The facts are a matter of controversy, but some have suggested that this, what was once a poem and now a popular song, The Twelve Days of Christmas, was actually a teaching tool for the Catholic Church when in the 1600's the Church of England was the only recognized church. In disguise the poem was memorized and recited, but recalled to mind the basic teachings of the faith. The true love mentioned in the song is not an earthly suitor, but refers to God Himself. The "me" refers to every baptized person who is part of the Christian faith. Each of the days represents some aspect of the faith that was important for children to learn.

Christian version and teaching of The Twelve Days of Christmas

My **True Love** is **God The Father** - God is love, and the Father in the Trinity The **Partridge in a Pear Tree** refers to **Jesus Christ**

1st Day - Jesus the Son of God - Jesus is symbolically presented as a mother partridge, the only bird that will die to protect its young. A ground bird that covers its young with her wings... My true love gave to me a partridge in a pear tree

2nd Day - Two Testaments - The Old and The New Testaments or the Bible, contains God's plan for the world. The doves are the Biblical roadmap available to everyone. Used by the poor as a sacrifice.... Two turtle doves

3rd Day - Faith, Hope and Love - French hens represents faith, hope and love referring to the love chapter in I Cor. 13 written by the apostle Paul....*Three french hens*

4th Day - The Four Gospels - The calling birds speak of the gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John that call out the name of Jesus and reveal who He is... Four calling birds

5th Day - Five Books of The Torah - Golden rings speak of value, the first five books are valuable to the foundation of the Judeo-Christian Faith. ... Five golden rings

6th Day - Six Days of Creation - six geese a laying refers to the first event in the Bible. Each egg is a day in creation, a time when the world was "hatched" or formed by God.... Six geese- a- laying

7th Day - Seven gifts of the Spirit - Seven Swans a-swimming. Hidden in this code are these 7 gifts of the Spirit. Prophecy, ministry, teaching, exhortation, giving, leading and compassion. Serving with the grace and beauty of a swan. ... Seven swans-a-swimming

8th Day - Eight Beatitudes - Eight maids a-milking, being a milk maid in this time period was one of the lowest jobs to be had. This code conveyed that Jesus cared as much for the servant as he did the royalty. The eight that were blessed included the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers and those who are persecuted for righteousness sake. ... *Eight maids-a-milking*

9th Day - Nine Fruits of the Spirit - The nine ladies dancing convey the joy of salvation when you live in the fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control....Nine ladies dancing

10th Day - The Ten Commandments - Ten lords a-leaping. The lords over the poor were the judge and jury of the day. Bringing to mind The 10 commandments were a reminder of the difference between right and wrong.... Ten lords-a-leaping

11th Day - Eleven Faithful Apostles - Eleven Pipers Piping. Brings to mind those who follow the piper. When Judas betrayed Jesus he was not following Jesus like the other 11..... Eleven pipers piping

12th Day - Twelve Points of Doctrine - The drummers drumming out the 12 doctrines outlined in the Apostles Creed. ... Twelve drummers drumming

So is it a silly song, or a refreshing reminder of the essential elements of the Christian Faith? In these days as we go about celebrating the most loved holiday of the year, let us be reminded to reveal the true meaning of Christmas.
