



THE BIBLE HAS THE ANSWER

Do the right thing. It will gratify some people and astonish the rest. (Mark Twain)

Integrity is doing the right thing even when no one is watching. (C.S. Lewis)

It is never wrong to do the right thing. (Mark Twain)

Sometimes it is better to lose and do the right thing than to win and do the wrong thing. (Author unknown)

In 1955 before he was elected to office, President John F. Kennedy wrote a little book called *PROFILES IN COURAGE*. In it he tells the stories of Americans from our past who took difficult stands or made tough decisions when it was not the popular thing to do.

With the approaching presidential election coming up I would like to illustrate the importance of each of our votes and why it can make a difference and possibly change the direction of our nation.

I will take two from President Kennedy's book and one from the Scriptures.

The first illustration tells the story of Edmund G. Ross and how his one vote prevented the impeachment of president Andrew Johnson in 1868.

Andrew Johnson was from the state of Tennessee and was the only Southern Member of Congress to refuse to secede with his state. According to Kennedy, Johnson was committed to the policies of President Abraham Lincoln whose approach to reconciliation with the South was in a constitutional and charitable way. President Lincoln 's approach was to permit the South to resume its place in the Union with as little delay and controversy as possible.

President Johnson had to deal with a group of radical republicans who wanted harsh treatment for the Southern States and to prolong military rule. He vetoed many bills because he felt they were unconstitutional and did not show kindness and mercy to our fellow Americans. Of course this caused him to butt heads with some of those in congress who felt the best solution was to impeach the president and put someone in office more sympathetic to their way of thinking.

The radical republicans needed of the 42 in the Senate, 36 members to vote for impeachment. Thus they could only lose 6 members who would vote not guilty. In a preliminary poll they knew that 6 republicans would vote not guilty, but Edmund Ross would not commit either way.

May 16th, 1868 the Senate held the impeachment vote. It came down to Edmund Ross from the anti-Johnson state of Kansas. He had replaced Senator Jim Lane who was a conservative Republican that supported Johnson's efforts to carry out Lincoln's reconstruction policies. But because of sharp condemnation for supporting Johnson along with failing health and other issues he took his life on July 1, 1866.

Ross who replaced Lane had played a major role in his condemnation for supporting Johnson.

Yet he along with 6 other Republicans thought of our nation and the damage it could do to our nation should it succeed. Even though Ross was no fan of President Johnson he would not tolerate the false charges brought against the president and his not quilty vote historians feel helped to save our nation.

"Neither Ross nor any other Republican who had voted for the acquittal of Johnson was ever re-elected to the Senate, not a one of them retaining the support of their party's organization. When he returned to Kansas in 1871, he and his family suffered social ostracism, physical attack, and near poverty."

None of the other six Senators liked President Johnson but voted their conscience and "did the right thing."

Who were these men? (1) William Fessenden of Maine, he felt the whole thing was mere madness, (2) John B. Henderson of Missouri, he introduced the 13th amendment abolishing slavery, (3) Peter Van Winkle of West Virginia, (4) Lyman Trumbull of Illinois. He had defeated Abe Lincoln for the Senate and drafted most of the reconstruction legislation which Johnson had vetoed. (5) Joseph Fowler of Tennessee – was horrified by the mad passion of the House in rushing through the impeachment resolution that was based on falsehood. (6) James Grimes of Iowa who had a stroke 2 days before the vote because of the abuse and threats heaped on him during the trial. Just before the balloting began, four men brought him in and placed him in his seat. With their help he stood up and said "not guilty."

The next person is Lucius Lamar from the state of Mississippi. He cast the deciding vote in the electoral college in the presidential race in 1876 between Rutherford B. Hayes and Samuel J. Tilden. This made the electoral votes 185 for Hayes and 184 for Tilden. Lamar, a man of law and honor agreed with the findings of the electoral commission of election fraud in three states and voted for Hayes even though the people in Mississippi wanted him to vote for Tilden.

Lamar in 1861 helped to draft the Mississippi Ordinance of Secession. He was the only high ranking confederate officer in the Senate. Yet he voted for what he felt was the right thing and is credited with helping the reconciliation of the North and the South.

Now let's look in the Scriptures. Moses was told by God to select one man from each tribe to go and spy out the promised land (Joshua 13:1-16). When they returned after 40 days, only Joshua from the tribe of Ephraim and Caleb from the tribe of Judah reported truthfully. The other ten men said that Israel couldn't take the land. There were too many giants. God asked Moses and Aaron how long should He bear with this evil congregation? (Joshua 14:26-27). Even though Joshua and Caleb had faith and told the truth, the people believed the lies of the other ten men and wanted to stone Joshua and Caleb (Joshua 14:10) until God intervened.

Because the people did not believe the truth, they were not permitted to enter the promised land, but to wander around in the dessert for 40 years.

There are no perfect people this side of heaven. We are all sinners. Some saved by grace and some still needing to be saved by grace. So how do we know how to vote?

The best we can do is vote for the candidate whose platform most closely lines up with Scripture and ask the Lord to reveal His will to us.


Ask the Lord to help us do the right thing even though it may not be popular and exercise our right to vote!!!




Mission Board Update and Sat7 News

The mission board remains active during this uninvited "downtime" with limited church activity. Our meetings have continued with zoom and two in person with social distancing in place. Our August meeting was via zoom and our special guest was Dennis Weins from Kansas City. He is the USA Church Relations Director for SAT 7. He spoke to us concerning the unprecedented challenges SAT 7 is facing in the 25 + years of television Christian Ministry to the Mid East and North Africa. Listed below are the numerous methods they have implemented and some of the responses to presenting the Gospel of Jesus Christ, along with promoting peace, comfort and education, to a fearful world looking for hope.

- Via internet, SAT 7 is able to bypass boundaries and borders to reach the earbuds of 30 million homes.
- Documented research reveals 2 million homes in Saudi are watching SAT 7 kids
- · Digital broadcasting to church meetings in Iran
- Increased viewing in Turkey by 60%
- Using different interactive media, there has been a 719% engagement increase on Saudi YouTube.
- Started having global devotions for SAT 7's 200 employees
- Closure of the Egyptian studio due to a positive Covid 19 case gave incentive for others to take equipment to their homes and continued to produce programs.
- Continued with "My School" productions in Syrian refugee camps.
- Women in camps in Egypt and Lebanon, who had never received an education are now learning to read and write in their homes.
- Arab people in the USA are connecting with SAT 7 because of fear from Covid 19 and are looking for hope.
- Churches and/or groups can sponsor a day's programming for \$640.
- Although SAT 7 teams do not publish newsletters for security reasons, there is a lot of information on SAT 7 USA website, SAT 7 Facebook page, and SAT 7 YouTube channel.
- Lebanon is one of the most open countries to freedom of religion. Their currency is deflated 7,000 to 1 US dollar.

Dennis thanked FBC for being a longtime and faithful supporter of the work and ministry of SAT 7. FBC began supporting SAT 7 in 2006.
